▶ Significance

- ⊳ God created us with a need to live **Meaningful Lives**.
- ⊳ People want their life to count for something. They wonder, "Why am I here?"

When we find fulfillment in the WORLD, we discover it is only temporary.

When we find fulfillment in GOD, it is complete and lasting.

- O Being fulfilled in Christ *frees us* from craving fulfillment in the things of the world.
- O It releases us to give of ourselves without needing anything in return.



The Good Samaritan

"Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him and departed, leaving him half dead.

- ...a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side.
- ...a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.
- ...a Samaritan...came to where he was, and when he saw him, he had compassion.
 - ...bound up his wounds...set him on his own animal
 - ...brought him to an inn and took care of him
 - ...took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying,

'Take care of him, and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back.'" Luke 10:30-35, ESV

Good Samaritan's Example of...

SIGNIFICANCE – We remember this Samaritan **because** he took care of someone else.

SECURITY – The Samaritan used **his money** to pay for the injured man's recovery.

SELF-WORTH – Samaritans were despised by Jews—including priests and Levites. Yet **only** a Samaritan saw enough value in the injured man to be willing to help him.

Two Denarii – average wage for two days labor

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REAL Significance

"I [Paul] press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."

Philippians 3:14, KJV

❖ Underline the "prize" that motivated Paul.

Paul's **only goal** was to please Christ. Nothing else was significant. This gave him a zeal and passion to continue following God despite the intense persecution he encountered.

REAL Self-Worth

"This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice [payment] for our sins."

1 John

1 John 4:10, NIV

- **Underline** how God showed His love for us.
- ♦ The worth of anything is determined by what someone is willing to pay for it.
- ♦ God gave His Son, Jesus Christ, for you! Can you think of anyone who values YOU more?

Deuteronomy 31:6, NIV


- **Underline** who goes with us.
- **Circle** two things God will **never** do.


"I will never leave you nor forsake you."
